You will recall we spoke at the coastal planning meeting in the Lancelin Sports Centre recently; I asked you about the letters detailed below. I realise that my question was out of context and appreciate that not all details would spring to mind.

As a reminder, you met with myself, Jungle Williams and Norm Skoglund on the 9th June in Lancelin regarding the threat to the Golf and Bowls Clubs of both Lancelin and Ledge Point and the perceived draconian methods of management at Gingin Shire. You agreed at the meeting that you would write letters to the following Ministers to seek support for our plight;

- Minister for Finance; Lands; Sport and Recreation; Citizenship and Multicultural Interests, the Hon Dr Tony Buti MLA
- Minister for Local Government, the Hon John Carey BA (Hons) MLA

Annex C: LANCELIN GOLF CLUB NEW APPAREL UPDATE as at 20 August 2021

Three businesses were approached regarding polo shirts (short and long sleeve for men and women), vests, caps and visors. The businesses include:

- Hypersports, Landsdale (currently provide our club shirts)
- Masport – Melbourne
- IDAthletic – Osborne Park.

The following information was discussed:

- Design and shape
- Material type and thickness
- Colour
- Cost/quote
- Manufacture (shirts screen printed or ready-made)
- Timeline

The clothing subcommittee has consulted with club members about most of the above points and a decision is close to being made. The main colour will be navy, with a small amount of orange (the same colour of the crayfish on our logo).

The polo shirt will be slightly different in design and shape for men and women. Long sleeve shirts will not be purchased due to a small number of people interested and additional design set up costs.

The vest will be the same as previously purchased by the club. Smooth outer material (soft shell) with fleecy inner lining with logo embroidered on front left.


Caps will be navy blue with our logo on the front. Visors will be white with “Lancelin Golf Club” inscribed on the front in navy blue.

What next? In the next week, subcommittee members will visit IDAthletic again to finalise design, material, type of visor and caps etc and gain a final quote on the proposed clothing as described above.

The timeline for production of the clothing will be about 5 weeks.

Dear Minister Carey

Gingin Shire sporting clubs

I write on behalf of sporting clubs in the Gingin Shire's Upper Coastal region, representing the communities of Lancelin and Ledge Point - in particular the Lancelin Golf Club, Lancelin Bowling Club, Ledge Point Golf Club and Ledge Point Bowling Club.

In line with the Shire of Gingin Strategic Community Plan Priority 3.2.1, which reads 'Develop and plan community infrastructure to improve use and financial sustainability', the Gingin Shire has reviewed sporting facilities in the Upper Coastal Region. During the study period, the rationalization and sustainability of facilities was a key focus, with Council not in favour of the continued duplication of facilities.

Having convened the Upper Coastal Sporting Facilities Working Group and engaged a consultant, the Gingin Shire received the draft Upper Coastal Sporting Facilities Master Plan in July 2020. The master plan recommended that Ledge Point become a centre of passive sports, such as bowls and golf, while Lancelin be a centre for active sports, such as netball, basketball and hockey.

To this end, the shire's Master Plan makes no mention of golf or bowls facilities at Lancelin, home to 50 percent of the Gingin Shire's population according to the 2016 ABS Census, with 16 percent of shire residents living in Ledge Point. According to the DPLH forecast, WA Tomorrow, growth within the shire in the next 25 years is forecast to be 16.4 percent, driven by its proximity to Perth, lifestyle and environment, with visitation rates increasing due to improved transport routes.

Understandably, the Master Plan has provoked an emotive response in the Lancelin and Ledge Point communities with residents adamant that bowls and golf clubs remain in each town. With a proud 40-year history, the Lancelin Golf Club is rated amongst the top 10 courses in Perth. This reticulated 18-hole course is open to members and visitors 12 months of the year and the committee assure me that the club is financially independent and thriving.

The Lancelin Golf Club has adopted the Act-Belong-Commit guidelines for positive mental health. Maintained and managed by volunteers, the 18-hole links course is considered one of the most challenging on the west coast. The committee speak of the importance of the club in providing a meeting place for members that offers a sense of belonging and purpose. The club acknowledges the importance of volunteer help and how this benefits mental health. The website clearly sets out information for volunteers, including benefits for volunteers who assist by working on the course or serving on the committee.

It is my understanding that if the Lancelin Bowling Club had to close its green and relocate to Ledge Point, the cost of an additional green to accommodate the extra bowlers would be in the order of \$300,000. Lancelin's bowling club members are no less passionate about their club than the town's golfers and it is understandable that members want both facilities to remain in Lancelin.

The Shire of Gingin has received this draft Sporting Facilities Master Plan without due consideration for the wishes of its Lancelin and Ledge Point ratepayers. I implore you to act to encourage the Shire to engage with Upper Coast ratepayers in a meaningful and respectful manner that will produce an outcome that recognises residents' recreational needs now and into the future.
